## Musings from the Pastor

June 2108

*For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Jeremiah 29:11*

Dear Friends in Christ,

Mid-June will mark one year since we began our relationship as pastor and congregation. Happy anniversary to us! It has been a time of great learning and growth for me as I continue to navigate this journey of "first call," and I'm grateful for your guidance, patience, trust and grace. Having experienced the full church year at Our Saviour's, I now have a better sense of our identity as a faith community and am hopeful for the future God has planned for us as we move forward together into a time of revitalization and renewal.

God has a mission for

us. It's our work, through scripture study, prayer, listening to one another and our neighbors, to discern what God might be up to among us, in Merrill, in the world, and in what ways God might be calling us to live, in word and deed, love for God and love for our neighbors.

At our June church council meeting we will welcome Pastor Jean DeVoll Donaldson, Bishop's Associate for Evangelical Mission, from the synod office. Pr. Jean is coming to listen to our hopes and concerns for Our Saviour's and give us guidance and ideas for ways we can enter into a process of renewed spiritual growth and vitality. The church council cannot and should not be the only ones who take leadership roles in this process. We are the *body* of Christ, a

*community* of faith bound together in love by the power of the Holy Spirit. Whatever shape this process takes, we will need people to be part of a "transformation team." Information about this will be given to the congregation as soon as the council discerns the general direction we think is best for us. Please keep the council in your prayers and pray about your own role in the life of the congregation. Is God calling you to share your gifts in a new way?

We can't know exactly what God has planned for us. More than likely we will experience some failure in the process, and God will challenge and stretch us and ask us to grow in ways we might not think we can. God has given us, however, the "tools" we need: faith in Jesus Christ

## Interactive Bulletin Boards

Let's talk! About what? Oh, faith and life and gratitude and blessings and ways God is active in all of everything. When should we talk? given day or week, every time you come, and write down gifts that you have and/or you see we have as a congregation. Slips of paper will be provided and again it would be really great if you would add your name to your sharings. Hard to explain this here...wait til you see it happening!

Neither of these is meant to take a lot of time but the interaction we have with one another will be treasured conversation and rich relationship building. We are a people of story, birthed by the Holy Spirit out of God's story of salvation in Christ. Let's tell it like it is!
