From the Pastor

A long time ago, in a seminary far, far away, I was interested in what was known as Diaconal Ministry. This is a ministry that was born out of the need for service to the community back in the 6th chapter of Acts. There were widows being neglected in the daily distribution of food, which means that women without a male connection to a very patriarchal society were not being supported in their daily needs. This disciples even said, "It is not right that we should neglect the word of God in order to wait on tables." (Acts 6:2) So, there were seven, "men of good standing, full of the spirit and of wisdom," (Acts 6:3) who were nominated to attend to the daily tasks of the community, like the distribution of food to all in need. They were called *diakonos*, which is has been translated deacon.

This model of service, to meet the needs of the community that are going unmet, is one that is very attainable for us. In some ways, if your parents raised you to value community, there was a sense that you were to take part in the life of it. Sometimes by attending events, and other times by hosting others and serving their needs. This also extended further to the needs of the community around us. If there was something that could be done, it is a duty to do it. Helping someone change a flat tire, being someone to talk to in tough times, and picking up trash on the highway, these are all services to the community.

This service was not that of a servant, slave, or *doulos*, in the Greek world. For the *doulos* had no part in the household other than to serve the needs of their master, and in fact, this is how Paul often saw himself in comparison to Christ Jesus. Paul was a *doulos* of the Gospel, carrying out his ministry at the command of Jesus. The *doulos* had no will other than their masters.

The service that *diakonos* engaged in was different, they were chosen by the community to serve the community. Chosen because they were of "good standing" not because they were skilled in any particular task. We often think that we cannot serve in certain ways because we don't have the skills. This service is not skill based, but faith based. It does not require us to be experts at anything in particular, but simply present for those in need. I cannot vouch for the food preparation skills of the Seven who were chosen in Acts 6, but there was nothing about being a gourmet chef mentioned there.

They are also not pastors. There are other words for pastor or preacher in the New Testament, but *diakonos* is not one of them. I often hear from people that they would be nervous and afraid to climb up into the pulpit and preach or speak in front of people. I understand that fear, I know that fear well. Some of the most faithful people I know, the people that I looked up to were not pastors, never mounted a pulpit, but when they

talked to you, they were there with you. When you needed something, they were there. There was no doubt about their faith because it was active in every relationship they had.

Think of those individuals who you looked up to in your lives. They have been *diakonos* to you. In some way they have helped you in a way less dramatic than dying on a cross, but no less powerful. This is who we are called to be when we talk about serving where Christ leads. Christ leads us and we are servants/slaves/*doulos* of Christ, but *diakonos* to one another. We do not blindly follow one another, doing whatever they want us to do. We hold on to a good standing with one another, being there when needed, helping when the opportunity presents itself, and all the while embodying the love of God that many people will only see through us.

We do this because of what Christ first did for us. We are no Jesus and don't need to replicate the cross. We cannot do so, but what we can do is be there for one another in ways that make a difference in their lives. Christ does not always lead us to far flung countries, but more often into the lives of friends and neighbors to share our faith in deed and in word.

The profits from the Scrip program are used for different teams and projects. Please purchase Scrip cards for all your shopping needs and support these projects.


Scrip will be available for purchase on the first weekend of the month before and after each worship service. We will do more weekends if the demand is there.
