From the Pastor

This will be a rushed writing because between setting up my office and settling into the rhythms of life here at Our Saviour's there has been a whole lot on my plate. This will be a brief note about my experience so far.

One of the discoveries that came from the office work was a large poster board that said: "**Core Value Identity Summary.**" This was work that the interim pastor had done with some folks around figuring out what a mission and vision for OSLC would be. Underneath this heading was the sentence fragment: "*A worship centered, joyful community serving where Christ leads.*" This is a wonderful sentiment and the council liked it too.

We value worship. Christians wouldn't be Christian without worship. The English roots of worship are to ascribe worth to something. That is why in some portrayals of ancient nobility, include people calling those above them, "Your Worship." When we gather, we ascribe worth of God for creating us, Christ for redeeming us, and the Holy Spirit for sustaining us throughout our lives. This also means that we approach the act of worship with care. You may have seen me facing different directions, moving around the channel, which is the technical, churchy word for everything past the communion rail. I have been doing so to shift our focus to various locations and aspects of worship. Next time you see me move around, think about where I am, what I'm looking at, and what that means about what is important in the moment.

I could write more about this, but I want to make sure that this and the rest of the Network gets into your hands. So, I'll talk more about being joyful and serving Christ later.

- Diaper Closet. Keep an eye on inventory and purchase supplies as needed; also needed, volunteer at the Diaper Closet for two hours once every few months.

# Monday Night Bible Study

"Everyday God", by Paula Gooder, (The author of "The Risen Existence", that we studied last spring) will be our text.

The church calendar highlights special festivals and seasons that focus on the spectacular actions of God such as Lent and Advent, Easter, and Christmas. But the longest season (split into two parts) is the time after Epiphany and the time of Pentecost. This season is also referred to as Ordinary Time in which the 33 weeks are numbered in the bulletins, "The First Sunday after Pentecost", etc.

This study focuses on 33 passages to recognize God's presence in everyday life; and encouraging us to see glimpses of God's glory in our ordinary lives.

Bible study meets Monday nights from 7:15 to 8:30 beginning Monday, September 11. All are welcome/encouraged to attend. There are no prerequisites. Study books are provided; bring your Bible or use one from the library.
